Ask an adult to give you a number to start from.</p> <p>Practice your times tables. Can you draw the tens sticks and ones to show this?</p>	<p>Choose 5 numbers from above.</p> <p>Write them in order from smallest to largest.</p> <p>Draw a number line and put them on it.</p> <p>Add one more ten to each number and write the new number. Have the ones changed?</p>

<p>Make up a dance routine for your favourite song like we have been doing with Just Dance.</p>	<p>Write out the alphabet down your page.</p> <p>Write a word associated with Christmas for each letter of the alphabet - remember to use capital letters if it is the name of a person or place.</p>	<p>Draw a portrait of a member of your family.</p> <p>Think of the different artists we have been learning about in school such as Van Gogh, Paul Klee and Picasso.</p> <p>Choose one style to create your image.</p>	<p>Use the pointillism technique to create a Christmas scene – you can use different colours like Georges Seurat .</p>
