

Science: States of matter

Children will compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases. They will observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled, and measure or research the temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius (°C). Classes will use investigation to identify the part played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle and associate the rate of evaporation with temperature.

Languages

The children will participate in weekly Italian sessions learning greetings and introducing themselves, the purpose of which is to fine tune fluency and intonation. Pair work will be a major feature of each lesson to ensure children have the maximum time possible to develop their speaking and listening skills.

Children will use patterns and create a prototype of a product. Practice their sewing skills. Use design criteria to evaluate a product identifying both strengths and areas for development in increasing detail.

Computing

Using Espresso coding children will design, write and debug programs that accomplish specific goals. They will begin to use logical reasoning to explain how some simple algorithms work and detect and correct simple errors.

Children will also learn the importance of using technology, safely, respectfully and responsibly.
