


Also please remember to check out Edshed for a range of activities linked to learning in school as well as espresso and purple mash. Your child should have a log in for each of these websites.

How do they make you feel? What is your favourite part? What is the same and what is different?</p> <p>See if you can clap along to the beat of your favourite song.</p>	<p><u>RE – Why is Jesus special to Christians?</u></p> <p>Think about what you already know about Jesus and discuss this with an adult.</p> <p>Jesus told special stories called parables. Can you find out about any of these stories? Draw pictures or write a sentence to show what you have found out.</p>	<p><u>PE</u></p> <p>Practise jumping, hopping and skipping. How many can you do in one minute?</p> <p>Set yourself a goal and see if you can beat your record. Ask your family to join in too.</p>	<p><u>Art</u></p> <p>Can you name the primary colours? Do you know what happens when you mix two colours together?</p> <p>Think about light and dark colours and warm and cold colours. Draw an image using only warm colours then have a go only using cold colours. Which one do you prefer?</p>
