


Reception February Grid

<p>We have been learning about space in school. Use a search engine like 'Swiggle' or 'Google' to research the different planets in our Solar System. Create a picture of each of the planets, using coloured pencils, pens or paint. Then write the name of each planet next to them. Can you write a fact about one of the planets?</p>  	<p>Create a 2D shape picture! You could draw a picture, using a ruler for the shapes that have straight sides. Or you could cut some shapes out of paper and stick them together to make a picture.</p> <p>Can you use some of these 2D shapes? Here's some ideas:</p>   	<p>Read these words by saying each letter sound and blending them together. Draw 3 analogue clocks with these times on and a picture beside them showing what you do at these times of the day. Can you find where the United Kingdom is? Look carefully and find 4 countries that start with the letter 'A' and write them.</p> 	<p>Draw a number line starting from 0 all the way to 10. When we find 1 more than a number, we are just adding one. It is easy to see on a number line because it is just the number that comes next (to the right). <i>eg 1 more than 6 is 7 on the number line</i></p> <p>Draw a circle around the numbers that are 1 more than...</p> <p>1 5 7 9</p>
